## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Three.

### AN ACT RELATIVE TO WARNING PREGNANT WOMEN ABOUT ALCOHOL.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 138 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting  
2 after section 2 the following new section: —

3 No person who owns or operates a tavern, restaurant, liquor  
4 store or other establishment that sells alcoholic beverages at retail  
5 shall sell alcoholic beverages in the Commonwealth unless the  
6 person causes to be posted signs which clearly read: "Warning:  
7 Drinking alcoholic beverages during pregnancy can cause mental  
8 retardation and other birth defects, according to the Surgeon  
9 General."

10 The Department of Public Health shall promulgate regulations  
11 with respect to the nature of the posting of said signs. Unless  
12 otherwise specified in said regulations, a sign as required herein  
13 shall not be smaller than 8½ inches wide by 5½ inches long, nor  
14 shall any lettering thereon be less than ⅜ inches in length.

15 Where the sale of alcoholic beverages is primarily intended for  
16 consumption off the premises, signs shall be placed conspicuously  
17 so as to insure that they are readable at all points of purchase.

18 Where the sale of alcoholic beverages is primarily intended for  
19 consumption on the premises, signs shall be placed conspicuously  
20 so as to insure that they are readable, and at least one additional  
21 sign shall be placed conspicuously so that it is readable in each  
22 public restroom.

23 Where a substantial percentage of the public patronizing an  
24 establishment offering alcohol for sale uses a language other than  
25 English as its primary language, an additional sign shall be worded  
26 in that primary language.

27 Any violation of the provisions of this section or any of the  
28 regulations promulgated hereunder shall be punished by a fine of  
29 not less than one hundred nor more than five hundred dollars.
