

By Mr. Scibelli of Springfield, petition of Robert T. Markel (mayor) and Anthony M. Scibelli (with the approval of the mayor and city council) relative to the board of licensing commissioners in the city of Springfield. Government Regulations. [Local Approval Received.]

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Three.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE BOARD OF LICENSING COMMISSIONERS IN THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section four
2 of chapter one hundred and thirty-eight of the General Laws, or
3 any other general or special law to the contrary, the board of
4 licensing commissioners of the city of Springfield shall consist of
5 five persons, who shall not be engaged, directly or indirectly, in
6 the manufacture or sale of alcoholic beverages, and who have been
7 residents of the city of Springfield for a least two years
8 immediately preceding their appointment. Two members shall be
9 appointed from each of the two leading political parties and the
10 fifth member may also be appointed from one of the said parties.
11 If any member of said board engages, directly or indirectly, in such
12 manufacture or sale, his office shall immediately become vacant.

1 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of section five of
2 chapter one hundred and thirty-eight of the General Laws, or any
3 other general or special law to the contrary, the terms of office
4 of the board of licensing commissioners of the city of Springfield
5 shall be so arranged as to expire concurrent with the term of the
6 mayor. Members shall continue to serve until their successor is
7 appointed. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the provisions of this
8 section shall not impair the term of any board member now
9 appointed in the city of Springfield on the effective date of this
10 act.

1 SECTION 3. Notwithstanding the provisions of section seven
2 of chapter one hundred and thirty-eight of the General Laws, or
3 any other general or special law to the contrary, no member of
4 the board shall receive any salary for services rendered to said
5 board.

1 SECTION 4. All other provisions of sections four to nine,
2 inclusive, of chapter one hundred and thirty-eight of the General
3 Laws, not in conflict with the above provisions of this act, shall
4 remain in full force and effect.

1 SECTION 5. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
