3 tigation and study of House documents numbered 541, 3034, 3036,
4 3982 and 4336 relative to civil rights of persons.

6 of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any,
7 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recom-
8 mendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the
9 House of Representatives on or before the last Wednesday in
10 December, nineteen hundred and ninety-three.
