By Mr. Tarr of Gloucester, petition of Bruce E. Tarr and Robert C. Buell (by vote of the town) for legislation to authorize the town of Rockport to use certain park land to construct a water supply standpipe. Local Affairs. [Local Approval Received.]

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF ROCKPORT TO USE CERTAIN PARK LAND TO CONSTRUCT A WATER SUPPLY STANDPIPE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The town of Rockport is hereby authorized to
2 use a portion of park land as the Pool Hill Town Forest for the
3 purpose of constructing, operating and maintaining a water
4 supply standpipe. Said parcel being shown on a plan entitled "Plan
5 of Pool Hill Tank Site, Rockport, Massachusetts, property of the
6 town of Rockport" prepared by Donohoe & Parkhurst, Inc. and
7 dated October 13, 1992, containing 4.1667 acres, more or less.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE

Article I. The Legislative Department

Section 1. The Senate shall be composed of twenty-four members, to be elected by the qualified electors of the State at the general election held in the year 1900, and in every fourth year thereafter.

Section 2. The Senate shall hold its first session on the first day of January next following the general election held in the year 1900, and in every fourth year thereafter.

Section 3. The Senate shall choose its officers and a speaker of the Senate, who shall preside over the Senate and shall have the same powers and authority as the speaker of the House of Representatives. The Senate shall also choose a sergeant-at-arms, who shall have the same powers and authority as the sergeant-at-arms of the House of Representatives. The Senate shall also choose a clerk, who shall have the same powers and authority as the clerk of the House of Representatives. The Senate shall also choose a chaplain, who shall have the same powers and authority as the chaplain of the House of Representatives. The Senate shall also choose a yeoman, who shall have the same powers and authority as the yeoman of the House of Representatives. The Senate shall also choose a doorkeeper, who shall have the same powers and authority as the doorkeeper of the House of Representatives. The Senate shall also choose a messenger, who shall have the same powers and authority as the messenger of the House of Representatives. The Senate shall also choose a sergeant-at-arms, who shall have the same powers and authority as the sergeant-at-arms of the House of Representatives. The Senate shall also choose a clerk, who shall have the same powers and authority as the clerk of the House of Representatives. Section 4. The Senate shall have the sole and exclusive power of impeachment.
