## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Three.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE USE OF CERTAIN LAND IN THE TOWN OF BROOKLINE WITHIN RESIDENTIAL DISTRICTS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any special or  
2 general law to the contrary, the town of Brookline is hereby  
3 authorized to regulate and restrict, through its zoning by-law, the  
4 use for educational purposes of land and structures located within  
5 residentially zoned districts; provided, however, that group  
6 residences and other facilities for mentally or physically  
7 handicapped persons shall be excluded from such regulation and  
8 restriction.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
