AN ACT RELATIVE TO DISTINCTIVE MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION PLATE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Section 2E of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing in
- 2 the 1996 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the
- 3 following paragraph:—
- 4 Section 2E. (c) The registrar shall furnish, upon application, to
- 5 the owners of private passenger motor vehicles distinctive regis-
- 6 tration plates, which shall display on their face a design indicating
- 7 support for eye research by the Lions Club of Massachusetts.
- 8 There shall be a fee of not less than forty dollars for such plates in
- 9 addition to the established registration fee for private passenger
- 10 vehicles, such fee being payable at the time of registration of such
- 11 vehicle and at each renewal thereof. The portion of the total fee
- 12 remaining after the deduction of costs directly attributable to the
- 13 issuance of such plates shall be deposited within 90 days of
- 14 receipt thereof in the General Fund established by section 2 of
- 15 chapter 29.
