AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A SPECIAL COMMISSION TO STUDY THE IMPACT OF TAX EXEMPT PROPERTY ON CITIES AND TOWNS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 There is hereby established a special commission to study the
- 2 impact on the financial and economic condition of cities and
- 3 towns of exemptions to the property tax provided under state and
- 4 federal law and to report on findings and conclusions and make
- 5 any recommendations that the commission may deem appropriate.
- 6 The commission shall consist of fifteen members and shall
- 7 include two members of the senate, one of whom shall be
- 8 appointed by the minority leader of the senate; three members of
- 9 the house of representatives, one of whom shall be appointed by
- 10 the minority leader of the house of representatives; the deputy
- 11 commissioner of revenue for local services; and nine members to
- 12 be appointed by the governor who are elected or appointed
- 13 municipal executive officers of cities and towns. The commission
- 14 shall rile a report with the clerks of the senate and house of repre-
- 15 sentatives no later than January first, two thousand.
