AN ACT DESIGNATING A CERTAIN BRIDGE IN THE TOWN OF BOURNE AS THE
TROOPER JAMES MATTALIANO MEMORIAL BRIDGE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General
Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 The Bourne Bridge, so-called, spanning the Cape Cod Canal, in
- 2 the town of Bourne, shall be designated and known as the Trooper
- 3 James Mattaliano Memorial Bridge, in memory of Trooper James
- 4 Mattaliano who was killed in the line of duty as a member of the
- 5 state police. Suitable markers bearing such designation shall be
- 6 attached thereto by the department of highways in compliance
- 7 with the standards of said department.
