

By Mr. Quinn of Dartmouth, petition of John F. Quinn and Mark C. Montigny relative to the appointment of the treasurer of the Dartmouth Fire District #3. Local Affairs.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF THE TREASURER OF THE DARTMOUTH FIRE DISTRICT NUMBER THREE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 71 of
2 chapter 48 of the General Laws, or any other general or special
3 law to the contrary, the prudential committee of the Dartmouth
4 fire district number three shall appoint a treasurer for a term not to
5 exceed three years.

1 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of section one of
2 this act, the incumbent in the office of treasurer upon the effective
3 date of this act shall continue to hold said office and perform the
4 duties thereof until the expiration of his term or a precedent
5 vacating office, provided, however, that a person elected to said
6 office in an election by which this act is accepted shall hold said
7 office and perform the duties thereof until a person is appointed to
8 said office under the provisions of section one.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall be submitted to the voters of the
2 Dartmouth fire district number three at a district election in the
3 form of the following question which shall be placed on the offi-
4 cial ballot to be used in said election: "Shall an act passed by the
5 General Court in the year 2000 entitled, 'An Act providing for the
6 appointment of the treasurer of the Dartmouth fire district number
7 three' be accepted?" If a majority of the votes cast in answer to

8 such question is in the affirmative, this act shall thereupon take
9 full effect, but not otherwise.
