AN ACT RELATIVE TO FIREARM IDENTIFICATION CARDS AND LICENSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The first sentence of subsection (9) of section
2 129B of chapter 140 of the General Laws, as amended by section
3 29 of chapter 180 of the acts of 1998, is hereby further amended
4 by adding the following:— provided, however, a cardholder shall
5 not be deemed to be in violation of this section for a period of 40
6 days thereafter.

1 SECTION 2. The first sentence of the first paragraph of subsec-
2 tion (i) of section 131 of chapter 140 of the General Laws, as
3 amended by section 41 of chapter 180 of the acts of 1998, is
4 hereby further amended by adding the following:— provided,
5 however, a license shall not be deemed to be in violation of this
6 section for a period of 40 days thereafter.
