The committee on Health Care, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 613) of Joseph J. Levitan that restaurant workers be subject to physical examinations every six months, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1380) of Brian Paul Golden, Patricia D. Jehlan, Cynthia S. Creem, Shirley Gomes, Robert A. DeLeo and Kay Khan for legislation to increase the number of sanitary stations in certain municipalities, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3539) of J. James Marzilli, Jr., Benjamin Swan and Patricia D. Jehlen relative to rules and regulations for the disposal of garbage, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 4539) ought to be adopted.

1 *Ordered*, That the committee on Health Care be authorized to
2 sit during the recess of the General Court to make an investigation
3 and study of current House documents numbered 613, relative to
4 restaurant workers, 1380, relative to sanitary stations, and 3539,
5 relative to the removal of garbage.
6 Said committee shall report to the General Court the results of
7 its investigation and its recommendations, if any, together with
8 drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into
9 effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of Represen-
10 tatives on or before the last Wednesday in December, two thou-
11 sand and two.
