The committee on Public Safety, to whom was recommitted the Bill relative to police mutual aid agreements (House, No. 1269), and on the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 669) of the International Brotherhood of Police officer and David M. Nangle relative to the arrest powers of municipal police officers, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 670) of the International Brotherhood of Police Officers and David M. Nangle relative to the appointment of special police officers by the Commissioner of Public Safety, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1270) of Kathi-Anne Reinstein and other members of the General Court relative to the training and testing of persons staffing a public safety answering point, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1640) of Thomas G. Nelson that the Registrar of Motor Vehicles be directed to issue handicapped plates to former prisoners of war, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2024) of David Paul Linsky and John A. Stefanini for legislation to expand the powers of police to arrest on fresh and continued pursuit in other jurisdictions, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2599) of Benjamin Swan, Patricia D. Jehlen, Susan C. Fargo, Gloria L. Fox and Shirley Owens-Hicks for legislation to prohibit inappropriate language by public safety officers in the Commonwealth, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2966) of Joseph F. Wagner that motor vehicle plates issued to disabled veterans be required to display the "International Symbol of Access" and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3794) of Paul E. Caron for legislation to expand the powers of police to arrest on fresh and continued pursuit in other jurisdictions reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 4568) ought to be adopted.

7 its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any,
8 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recom-
9 mendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the
10 House of Representatives on or before the last Wednesday in
11 December, two thousand and one.
