Coppola and other members of the General Court that the Registrar of Motor Vehicles be authorized to issue certain distinctive registration plates and providing for the use of revenues from such plates for the establishment of a children's education fund, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 664) of Michael J. Coppola and other members of the General Court for legislation to establish a library preservation trust fund from the proceeds of a special motor vehicle registration plate, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 863) of John A. Lepper and other members of the General Court relative to providing for special license plates for the Rotary Clubs International, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1077) of Thomas P. Kennedy that the Registrar of Motor Vehicles be authorized to issue special license plates to organ donors, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1265) of Bradford Hill that the Registrar of Motor Vehicles be directed to issue distinctive plates representing the search for the cure of cancer, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2393) of Brian M. Cresta and Richard R. Tisei for legislation to provide for a distinctive organ donation motor vehicle registration plate, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2771) of Antonio F. D. Cabral, Christine E. Canavan, Robert M. Koczera and another for legislation to provide distinctive license plates for the Department of Environmental Management bearing a designation and design representing various historical vessels, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2774) of Christopher J. Hodgkins, Ellen Story, Christine E. Canavan and Colleen M. Garry that the Registrar of Motor Vehicles be authorized to issue distinctive license plates with a design representing the University of Massachusetts, the petition (accompanied by bill, House,

No. 2777) of J. Michael Ruane that the Registrar of Motor Vehicles be authorized to issue distinctive license plates for constables, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3167) of Stephen Kulik, George N. Peterson, Jr., and Michael J. Rodrigues that the Registrar of Motor Vehicles be directed to issue distinctive license plates for the establishment of an agricultural trust fund, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3173) of Benjamin Swan, Shirley Owens-Hicks, Susan C. Fargo, Gloria L. Fox, Kay Khan and Marie P. St. Fleur that the Registrar of Motor Vehicles be authorized to issue distinctive motor vehicle plates indicating support for violence prevention education, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3597) of Theodore C. Speliotis that the Registrar of Motor Vehicles be directed to issue open space preservation license plates, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3789) of Paul E. Caron for legislation to provide for the transfer of certain motor vehicle registration fees to the education program of the Basketball Hall of Fame and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3973) of Shirley Owens-Hicks, other members of the General Court and others that the Registrar of Motor Vehicles be directed to issue a distinctive motor vehicle license plate for the Black United Fund of Massachusetts reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 4582) ought to be adopted.

4 1265, 2393, 2771, 2774, 2777, 3167, 3173, 3597, 3789, and 3973  
5 relative to Distinctive License Plates and other related issues.

6     Said committee shall report to the General Court the results of  
7 its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any,  
8 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recom-  
9 mendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the  
10 House of Representatives on or before the last Wednesday in  
11 December, two thousand and one.
