The committee on Government Regulations, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 387) of Guy W. Glodis, Paul Kujawski, George N. Peterson, Jr., Paul K. Frost and other members of the General Court for legislation relative to Native American government economic self sufficiency; the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 393) of James P. Jajuga, Edward G. Connolly and Emile J. Goguen for legislation relative to the establishment of casino gambling in the Commonwealth; the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 394) of James P. Jajuga, Carol A. Donovan and Emile J. Goguen for legislation relative to enhanced 911 service at Logan International Airport; the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 403) of Richard T. Moore, Bruce E. Tarr, David C. Bunker, Jr., other members of the General Court and another for legislation to allow farm-winery license holders to ship wines; the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 469) of Robert E. Travaglini for legislation to establish the Massachusetts Gaming Control Act; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 601) of Bruce J. Ayers for legislation to prohibit the practice of body piercing, so-called, unless licensed by the Department of Public Health; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1584) of George Rogers and Edward G. Connolly relative to authorizing casino gambling in the Commonwealth and the establishment of a high stakes Bingo operation in the New Bedford-Fall River area; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2156) of Paul E. Caron and another that the Department of Telecommunications and Energy be directed to establish a single electric utility rate for houses of worship; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2158) of Paul E. Caron and another for legislation to further regulate retail and wholesale electric companies; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2162) of Vincent A. Pedone for legislation to prohibit telephone charges for touch tone service; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3091) of Thomas J. O'Brien, Mary Jane Simmons and Kevin J. Murphy that the Board of

State Examiners of Plumbers and Gas Fitters be directed to establish continuing education programs; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3092) of Eugene L. O'Flaherty for legislation to regulate the use of utility poles; reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 4712) ought to be adopted.

11 mendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the
12 House of Representatives on or before June 30, 2002.
