AN ACT ESTABLISHING A SICK LEAVE BANK FOR COLLEEN McDONALD, AN EMPLOYEE OF THE TRIAL COURT OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

1 *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would tend to
2 defeat its purpose, which is to establish forthwith a sick leave
3 bank for a certain employee of the trial court, therefore it is
4 hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the im-
5 mediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law or rule or regula-
2 tion to the contrary, the trial court of the commonwealth shall
3 establish a sick leave bank for Colleen McDonald, an employee of
4 Quincy division of the district court department of the trial court.
5 Any employee of the trial court may voluntarily contribute 1 or
6 more sick, personal or vacation days to the sick leave bank for use
7 by Colleen McDonald. When Colleen McDonald terminates
8 employment with the trial court or requests to dissolve the sick
9 leave bank, the balance of sick leave shall be transferred to the
10 trial court paid leave bank.
