AN ACT NAMING TWO BRIDGES AND A PARK IN THE TOWN OF BILLERICA.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The bridge located on Concord Road and
2 extending over Route 3 in the town of Billerica shall be desig-
3 nated and known as the George C. Brainerd Bridge. The depart-
4 ment of highways shall erect and maintain a suitable marker on
5 said bridge bearing said designation in compliance with the stan-
6 dards of said department.

1 SECTION 2. The bridge located on Treble Cove Road and
2 extending over Route 3 in the town of Billerica shall be desig-
3 nated and known as the Veteran's Memorial Bridge. The depart-
4 ment of highways shall erect and maintain a suitable marker on
5 said bridge bearing said designation in compliance with the stan-
6 dards of said department.

1 SECTION 3. The water park in Warren Manning State Park in
2 the town of Billerica shall be designated and known as Jean F.
3 Coppinger Memorial Park.
