

By Mr. Rogers of Norwood, petition of John H. Rogers (by vote of the town) for legislation to provide for the appointment of a treasurer in the town of Norwood. Local Affairs. [Local Approval Received.]

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE APPOINTMENT OF THE POSITION OF TREASURER IN THE TOWN OF NORWOOD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 4 of Chapter 197 of the Acts of 1914 is
2 hereby amended by striking out section 4 in its entirety and
3 inserting in place thereof the following:—

4 Section 4. The selectmen elected as provided in section 2 shall
5 appoint, as soon as practicable, a person suitably qualified to the
6 office of town treasurer and collector of taxes. Said town treasurer
7 and collector of taxes shall enjoy all the powers and rights and be
8 subject to all the duties and liabilities conferred or imposed by
9 law upon town treasurers and collectors of taxes and each of them,
10 whether now existing or hereafter created, and shall hold office
11 for three years from the date of his appointment and until his suc-
12 cessor is chosen and qualified, except as herein provided. Said
13 treasurer and collector of taxes shall receive such compensation
14 for his services as the town may determine. In case of a vacancy
15 in said office, the selectmen forthwith shall fill said vacancy for
16 the unexpired term. Said town treasurer and collector of taxes
17 shall be sworn to the faithful performance of his duties by the
18 chairman of the board of selectmen, or by the town clerk and
19 accountant, or by a justice of the peace.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
