AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RENEWABLE ENERGY TRUST FUND.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 40J, Section 4E Massachusetts Renewable Energy
- 2 Trust Fund.
- 3 Inserting the words "Thermal Depolymerization" into Chapter
- 4 40J, section 4E, Subsection (f)1. It should read as follows:
- 5 For the purposes of expenditures from the fund, renewable
- 6 energy technologies eligible for assistance shall include the
- 7 following: Thermal Depolymerization, solar photovoltaic and
- 8 solar thermal electric energy; wind energy; ocean thermal, wave,
- 9 or tidal energy; fuel cells; landfill gas; waste-to-energy which is a
- 10 component of conventional municipal solid waste plant tech-
- 11 nology in commercial use; naturally flowing water and hydroelec-
- 12 tric; low emission, advanced commercial use; naturally flowing
- 13 water and hydroelectric; low emission, advanced biomass power
- 14 conversion technologies, such as gasification using such biomass
- 15 fuels as wood, agricultural, or food wastes, energy crops, biogas,
- 16 biodiesel, or organic refuse-derived fuel.
