AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE SALEM AND BEVERLY WATER SUPPLY BOARD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 700 of the acts of 1913 is hereby amended by striking 2 out section 1, as most recently amended by chapter 192 of the acts of 1981 and inserting in place thereof the following sections:

of 1981 and inserting in place thereof the following sections:— Section 1. A board is hereby created which shall be known as 4 the Salem and Beverly Water Supply Board and shall consist of five members. The city engineer of the city of Salem and the commissioner of public works in the city of Beverly shall be members of said board, ex officio. The governor shall appoint a member for 8 a term of 3 years who shall not be a resident of either of said cities, or hold property, or have a usual place of business therein, 10 and may be removed at any time by the governor. He shall be the 11 12 chairman, and shall receive as compensation, so long as he shall 13 continue to be a member of said board, such sum as the board 14 shall fix, but in no event less than \$4,500 per year, nor more than 15 \$6,500 per year. The mayors of the cities of Salem and Beverly 16 shall each appoint, subject to the approval of their respective city council, 1 member of the board for a term of 3 years who shall be 17 18 a resident of their respective cities. Said appointees must be 19 appropriately qualified to serve. In case of a vacancy occurring in 20 the office of the nonresident member, it shall be filled by appoint-21 ment for the unexpired part of the term by the governor. In the

event of the incapacity of an ex officio member of said board, the

mayor of the city represented by such member shall appoint an

24 employee of the department wherein such incapacity exists as an 25 interim member to serve in place of such ex officio member until

26 he is able to resume his duties as a member of said board, and the

27 chairman shall be notified in writing of such appointment. In case

28 of a vacancy occurring in the position of the members appointed

29 by the mayors, it shall be filled by the respective mayor subject to

30 the approval of that community's city council for the unexpired

31 term. Said interim members shall represent his/her respective city

32 as a member of the board with full power including the right to
