The committee on Education, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1002) of Kathi-Anne Reinstein relative to reimbursing cities, towns and school districts for the costs of acquiring land under the school building assistance program; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1003) of Kathi-Anne Reinstein relative to including certain land acquisition costs in the calculation of facilities grants under the school building assistance program; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1052) of Louis L. Kafka and William C. Galvin that the Department of Education be directed to establish a commission to make an investigation and study of ergonomic design standards for schools in the Commonwealth; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1061) of Thomas J. O'Brien and Karen E. Spilka relative to reimbursements for school construction in growth communities, so-called; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1095) of Robert F. Fennell and others relative to the definition of "approved school project" under the school building assistance program; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1106) of James E. Vallee and others for an appropriation of a certain sum of money for reimbursement to member communities of the Tri-County Regional School District for the costs of a certain reconstruction project; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1107) of James E. Vallee, Susan W. Pope and others for legislation to establish minimum reimbursement levels for certain school building reconstruction projects; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1139) of John W. Scibak and others relative to major repair projects under school building assistance; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1150) of Paul Kujawski relative to promoting safety in the teaching of technology in the public schools; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1161) of Bradley H. Jones, Jr., and others relative to the establishment of a school building assistance data base system; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1180) of Edward G. Connolly, and others relative to school building

construction grants; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1210) of Geoffrey D. Hall and others (by vote of the town) relative to certain school construction projects in the town of Chelmsford; reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 4821) ought to be adopted.
