AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING EMS BENEFITS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 32, Section 100 is hereby amended in line
2 14 after the word “death,” by inserting the following:— “or if an
3 emergency medical technician is killed or sustains injuries in the
4 performance of his duties which result in his death;” and is further
5 amended by striking every instance therein where the following
6 phrase appears: “firefighter, police officer or corrections officer” and
7 inserting in place thereof the phrase:— “firefighter, police officer,
8 corrections officer or municipal or public emergency medical techni-
9 cian.”

1 SECTION 2. Chapter 32, Section 100A is hereby further
2 amended by striking every instance therein where the following
3 phrase appears:— “firefighter, police officer or corrections officer”
4 and inserting in place thereof the following phrase:— “firefighter,
5 police officer, corrections officer or municipal or public emergency
6 medical technician.”
