AN ACT ESTABLISHING A DISTINCTIVE MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION PLATE IN THE MEMORY OF POLICE OFFICERS KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 2 of Chapter 90 of the General Laws, as most recently
2 amended by Section 3 of Chapter 220 of the acts of 2004, is hereby
3 further amended by adding the following paragraph:—

4 The registrar shall furnish, upon application, to owners of private
5 passenger motor vehicles distinctive registration plates which shall
6 display on their face a design in memory of police officers killed in
7 the line of duty. There shall be a biennial fee of not less than \$40 for
8 such plates in addition to the established registration fee for private
9 passenger motor vehicles, such fee being payable at the time of reg-
10 istration of such vehicle and at each renewal thereof. The portion of
11 the fee remaining after the deduction of costs directly attributable to
12 the issuance of such plates shall be transferred within 90 days of
13 receipt thereof to a fund to be set up for the purpose of establishing a
14 monument in memory of those fallen officers.
