AN ACT

Concerning Drains and Sewers in the Town of Somerville.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. The selectmen of the town of Somerville
2 may lay, make and maintain in said town all such
3 drains or common sewers through the lands of any
4 persons or corporations, as they shall adjudge to be
5 necessary for the convenience or the health of its
6 inhabitants, and may repair all such drains or com-
7 mon sewers from time to time when repairs thereof
8 shall be necessary.

1 SECT. 2. Whenever any lands or real estate shall
2 be taken by virtue of this act, the said selectmen
3 shall proceed in the taking thereof in the same man-
4 ner in all respects as they now are or hereafter may

5 be required by law to proceed in taking land for town-
6 ways, and all persons and corporations suffering
7 damage in their property by reason of the laying,
8 making or maintaining of any drains or common sew-
9 ers, as aforesaid, shall have all the rights and remedies
10 for the ascertainment and the recovery of the amount
11 of such damage which are now or hereafter may be pro-
12 vided by law for the ascertainment and the recovery
13 of damage for lands taken for town-ways.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from and after
2 its passage.
