R E S O L V E

Making an Appropriation for the Compensation of the Members and Officers of the Valuation Committee of 1860.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of this Commonwealth, to each member of the valuation committee of 1860, three dollars and fifty cents for each and every day's actual attendance upon sessions of said committee, and to six of the officers in attendance on said committee, three dollars and thirty-three cents for each and every day's actual attendance on said committee, and to two messengers two dollars and twenty cents for each day's actual attendance on said committee, in all cases for time exceeding the ninety days prescribed by chapter eighty-three of the acts and resolves of eighteen hundred and sixty, and the further sum of one hundred dollars to be paid to the sergeant-at-arms, for extra services, in attendance upon the said valuation committee; and the sum of two thousand seven hundred and eighty dollars and twenty-five cents is hereby appropriated out of the current revenue of the Commonwealth to meet said expenditures.
