AN ACT

Concerning the Lynn and Boston Railroad Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. The selectmen of the several towns and
2 the mayor and aldermen of the city of Lynn, in which
3 the Lynn and Boston Railroad Company was by the
4 act of its incorporation authorized to construct its rail-
5 road, are hereby authorized to locate the tracks of the
6 railroad of said company upon and over such of the
7 streets and highways within their respective corpora-
8 tions, as they may from time to time respectively
9 determine, with the assent in writing of said company.

1 SECT. 2. All locations made under the provisions
2 of this act shall be made in all respects in pursuance

3 of the provisions of the act by which said company
4 was incorporated. And said company is hereby
5 authorized to construct, maintain and use its railroad
6 located in pursuance of this act, upon and over the
7 streets and highways of said towns and the city of
8 Lynn, with the same powers and privileges, and sub-
9 ject to the same duties, liabilities and restrictions, as
10 if the same had been located and constructed under
11 the authority of the act by which said company was
12 incorporated.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall be void so far as relates to
2 the construction of said railroad in either of said
3 towns and city, unless the same shall be accepted by
4 the selectmen of said towns and the mayor and alder-
5 men of said city respectively, and by said company,
6 within one year after its passage.
