### AN ACT

To increase the Capital Stock of the East Boston Wharf Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of he same, as follows:—*

1   SECT. 1. The East Boston Wharf Company is  
2 hereby authorized to increase its capital stock by add-  
3 ing thereto five hundred thousand dollars, and to  
4 invest the same in the purchase of real estate adjoin-  
5 ing the land now owned by said corporation, a de-  
6 scription of which real estate is hereafter set forth, to  
7 be used as may be necessary and convenient to carry  
8 on the business for which the said company was  
9 incorporated: *provided*, that no shares in the capital  
10 stock hereby authorized shall be issued for a less sum  
11 or amount than the par value of the shares in the  
12 original capital stock of said corporation.

1    SECT. 2. The real estate which said corporation  
2 is hereby authorized to purchase and hold is described  
3 as follows, to wit:—A lot or parcel of land bounded  
4 and described as follows, viz. : Beginning at the south-  
5 east corner of the premises now owned by said corpo-  
6 ration on Sumner Street and at the centre of Mill  
7 Street, thence running westerly through the centre of  
8 Mill Street and bounded on said corporation land four  
9 hundred feet. Then turning and running southerly  
10 one hundred and thirty feet. Then turning and run-  
11 ning westerly about seven hundred and sixty feet to  
12 the commissioners' line. Thence running northerly  
13 by said commissioners' line three hundred and twenty  
14 feet more or less, to a point on the line of Carleton's  
15 estate, so called. Then turning and running north-  
16 easterly eight hundred and seventy feet to Sumner  
17 Street. Then turning and running south easterly one  
18 hundred and ninety feet on Sumner Street to the  
19 point of beginning. Said premises being situated in  
20 that part of Boston called East Boston.
