AN ACT

To authorize the First Parish in Dorchester to sell Real Estate.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1 SECT. 1. The First Parish in Dorchester is hereby
2 authorized to sell at public or private sale, at such
3 time or times as it may choose, a certain lot of pasture
4 land belonging to said Parish, and situated on Brush
5 Hill Turnpike, in the town of Milton, in the county
6 of Norfolk, and known as the "Little Pasture";
7 and the treasurer of said parish, for the time being,
8 shall have authority to execute and deliver deeds to
9 convey the same in fee simple or otherwise.

1 SECT. 2. The proceeds of the sale of said land shall
2 be permanently invested, in such manner as said
3 parish shall direct, and the income arising therefrom
4 shall be applied exclusively to the support of the
5 ministry in said parish.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from and
2 after its passage
