AN ACT

To confirm certain doings of the Town of Ipswich.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. The election of moderator and town
2 officers heretofore made at the town meetings in the
3 town of Ipswich, in the year eighteen hundred and
4 sixty-five, so far as the same may appear illegal, for
5 the reason that the check-list was not used in the
6 said elections, is hereby ratified and confirmed, and
7 the same shall be taken and deemed good and valid
8 in law, to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
