AN ACT

Concerning Insolvent Estates of Deceased Persons.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. In any case in which the estate of a
2 deceased person has been or shall be represented
3 insolvent, and commissioners appointed fail or have
4 failed fully to perform their duties within the time
5 limited, or to make their return within a reasonable
6 time, the probate court may revoke their appoint-
7 ment; and at any time after the revocation of an
8 appointment heretofore or hereafter made, the probate
9 court may appoint new commissioners, although the
10 times limited by law for the proof of claims may have
11 expired; and all limitations of time for the proof of
12 claims shall in such case begin to run from the date
13 of the appointment of such new commissioners.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect on its
2 passage.
