AN ACT

For the protection of Sea-Fowl in the Waters of Tisbury.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. No person shall drive, chase or pursue
2 with boats, in the waters in and bordering upon the
3 town of Tisbury, any of the birds commonly called
4 sea-fowl.

1 SECT. 2. Any person offending against the provi-
2 sions of the preceding section, shall forfeit and pay
3 for each offence, a fine of not more than five dollars,
4 to be recovered by prosecution before any court of
5 competent jurisdiction.
