AN ACT

Regulating the Method of Lighting Passenger Railway
Cars.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
tives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of
the same, as follows :—*

1 SECT. 1. No railway passenger cars in this Com-
2 monwealth shall be lighted by lamps burning any
3 explosive oils.

1 SECT. 2. Any corporation or persons violating the
2 provisions of this act shall be punished by fine not
3 exceeding five hundred dollars nor less than one
4 hundred dollars for each violation.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect on the first
2 day of May next.
