AN ACT

To incorporate the Young Men's Literary Institute of Plymouth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. William E. Barnes, Arthur Lord, Charles
2 C. Bates, Charles H. Rogers, Richard Hinchcliffe,
3 their associates and successors, are hereby made a
4 corporation by the name of the Young Men's Literary
5 Institute of Plymouth, for the purpose of maintain-
6 ing a library in the town of Plymouth, and for
7 literary and educational purposes; with all the powers
8 and privileges, and subject to all the duties, liabilities
9 and restrictions set forth in all general laws which
10 now are or may hereafter be in force and applicable
11 to such corporations.

1 SECT. 2. Said corporation may hold real and per-
2 sonal estate, for the purposes aforesaid, to an amount
3 not exceeding fifty thousand dollars.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
