AN ACT

To incorporate the Haverhill Odd Fellows' Hall Association.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1 SECT. 1. F. J. Stevens, A. B. Jaques, W. A.
2 Brooks, their associates and successors, trustees of the
3 fund of the Odd Fellows' Hall Association in Haver-
4 hill, are hereby made a corporation, under the name
5 of the Haverhill Odd Fellows' Hall Association, for
6 the purpose of managing and administering the funds
7 belonging to said association, and of building and
8 maintaining a hall, according to the terms of their
9 trust ; with all the powers and privileges, and subject
10 to all the duties, restrictions and liabilities set forth
11 in all general laws which now are or may hereafter
12 be in force applicable to such corporations.

1 SECT. 2. Said corporation may hold real and per-
2 sonal estate to an amount not exceeding one hundred
3 thousand dollars.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage. •
