### AN ACT

To incorporate the Worcester Printing Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—*

1    SECT. 1. E. Everett Burden, Charles B. Thomas  
2 and Charles E. Chamberlin, their associates and suc-  
3 cessors, are hereby made a corporation by the name  
4 of the Worcester Printing Company, for the purpose  
5 of printing and publishing newspapers in the city of  
6 Worcester; with all the powers and privileges, and  
7 subject to all the duties, restrictions and liabilities set  
8 forth in all general laws which now are or may here-  
9 after be in force relating to such corporations.

1    SECT. 2. Said corporation, for the purposes afore-  
2 said, may hold real estate to the amount of thirty  
3 thousand dollars, and the whole amount of the capital

4 stock of said company shall not exceed fifty thousand  
5 dollars, which shall be divided into shares of one  
6 hundred dollars each.

1     SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its pas-  
2 sage.
