AN ACT

Confirming the Title of James A. Dodge in certain Real
Estate.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
tives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of
the same, as follows:—*

1 SECT. 1. The conveyance of real estate made by
2 Allen Dodge, Francis Dodge and Robert F. Dodge,
3 trustees under the will of Francis Dodge, late of
4 Georgetown, in the District of Columbia, deceased, to
5 James A. Dodge, by their deed recorded in the registry
6 of deeds for the county of Essex, book seven hundred
7 and nine, page one hundred and fifty-seven, is hereby
8 confirmed and made valid and effectual to pass a clear
9 title to the real estate described in said deed, in fee
10 simple to said James A. Dodge and his heirs and
11 assigns forever.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
