AN ACT

In relation to widening Beacon Street and adjacent
Avenues in the City of Boston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. The board of street commissioners of the
2 city of Boston, with the concurrence of the city coun-
3 cil of said city, may widen within the limits of said
4 city, the following named streets and highways, viz.:
5 Beacon street westerly from Gloucester street, Brigh-
6 ton avenue north-westerly from its intersection with
7 Beacon street, and Brookline avenue south-westerly
8 from its intersection with Beacon street, to such width
9 as they in their judgment shall deem to be for the
10 common benefit of the inhabitants of said city, and
11 said city shall pay for the land and property so taken;
12 which highways and streets said city of Boston shall
13 not be obliged to complete sooner than the city coun-
14 cil of said city may deem it expedient so to do.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its pas-
2 sage.
