AN ACT

To incorporate the Stockbridge Savings Bank.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. Marshall Warner, Henry J. Dunham,
2 and Charles M. Owen, their associates and successors,
3 are hereby made a corporation by the name of the
4 Stockbridge Savings Bank to be located in the town
5 of Stockbridge; with all the powers and privileges,
6 and subject to all the duties, liabilities, and restric-
7 tions set forth in all general laws which now are or
8 may hereafter be in force in this Commonwealth re-
9 lating to institutions for savings.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its pas-
2 sage.
