AN ACT

To incorporate the Union for Good Works, in New
Bedford.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1 SECT. 1. S. Griffitts Morgan, C. B. H. Fessenden,
2 Hiram Van Campen, James M. Lawton, Emily H.
3 Bourne, Amelia H. Jones, I. H. Bartlett, junior, Wil-
4 liam J. Potter, Henry H. Forbes and Alanson Borden,
5 all of New Bedford, their associates and successors, are
6 hereby made a corporation, by the name of the Union
7 for Good Works, for the purpose of promoting the
8 religious, educational and charitable objects of the
9 said association ; with all the powers and privileges,
10 and subject to all the duties, restrictions and liabilities
11 set forth in all general laws which now are or may
12 hereafter be in force applicable to such corporations.

1 SECT. 2. Said corporation may hold real and
2 personal estate, not exceeding one hundred thousand
3 dollars in value, for the purposes aforesaid.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its pas-
2 sage.
