AN ACT

To incorporate the Odd Fellows' Hall Association of Beverly.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECT. 1. Andrew K. Ober, Isaac Appleton,
2 Leonard C. Foss, their associates and successors,
3 are made a corporation by the name of the "Odd
4 Fellows' Hall Association, of Beverly," for the
5 purpose of erecting or purchasing and maintaining
6 a building in the town of Beverly for the accom-
7 modation and purposes of an Odd Fellows' hall and
8 any other lawful purpose, with all the powers and
9 privileges and subject to all the duties, restrictions
10 and liabilities set forth in all general laws, which now
11 are or hereafter may be in force, applicable to such
12 corporation.

1 SECT. 2. The capital stock of said corporation
2 shall not exceed seventy-five thousand dollars, di-

3 vided into shares of the par value of one hundred
4 dollars, and said corporation may hold for the pur-
5 poses aforesaid real and personal estate not exceed-
6 ing the amount of the capital stock: *provided*, that
7 said corporation shall incur no liability until ten
8 thousand dollars of its capital stock has been paid
9 in in cash.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
