AN ACT

To incorporate the Ancient Order of Hibernians, in
Fall River.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECT. 1. John McNulty, Patrick J. Lunney,
2 Simon Garihy, their associates and successors, are
3 made a corporation, by the name of the Ancient
4 Order of Hibernians, in Fall River, for the pur-
5 pose of erecting, or purchasing and maintaining a
6 building in the city of Fall River, for the accom-
7 modation and purposes of said order, and any
8 other lawful purpose; with all the powers and
9 privileges, and subject to all the duties, restrictions
10 and liabilities set forth in all general laws which
11 now are or hereafter may be in force, applicable to
12 such corporations.

1 SECT. 2. The capital stock of said corporation
2 shall not exceed twenty thousand dollars, divided

3 into shares of the par value of twenty-five dollars;
4 and said corporation may hold, for the purposes
5 aforesaid, real and personal estate not exceeding
6 the amount of the capital stock: *provided*, that
7 said corporation shall incur no liability until five
8 thousand dollars of its capital stock has been paid
9 in in cash.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
