AN ACT

To provide a Clerk for the Police Court of Gloucester.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECT. 1. The governor, with the advice and
2 consent of the council, shall nominate and appoint
3 a clerk of the police court of Gloucester, who shall
4 hold his office for the term of five years unless
5 sooner removed by the governor and council.

1 SECT. 2. Said clerk shall perform all the duties
2 now prescribed by the General Statutes for clerks
3 of police courts ; and all the provisions of law now
4 applicable to clerks of police courts shall apply to
5 said clerk.

1 SECT. 3. Said clerk shall receive an annual
2 salary of eight hundred dollars, to be paid from
3 the treasury of the Commonwealth.
