AN ACT

Providing for the Disposition of Useless Records, Schedules and Papers accumulating in the Bureau of Statistics of Labor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. All records, schedules and papers
2 accumulating in the bureau of statistics of labor,
3 that may be considered of no value by the chief
4 of said bureau, may be destroyed or sold as he
5 may deem best: *provided*, the authority of the
6 governor and council shall first be obtained for
7 such destruction or sale; and *provided*, further,
8 that if such useless records, schedules and papers
9 shall be disposed of by sale, the proceeds thereof
10 shall be turned into the treasury of the Common-
11 wealth.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
