AN ACT

To amend the Act incorporating the Proprietors of Boston Pier or the Long Wharf and the Act amendatory thereto.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The proprietors of Boston Pier or the Long
2 Wharf may, at any meeting called for the purpose
3 and properly notified, at which the number of
4 proprietors required by the existing charter are
5 present in person or by proxy, determine by its
6 by-laws what number of stockholders shall there-
7 after attend at any meeting, either in person or
8 by proxy, or what number of shares or amount
9 of interest shall be represented at any meeting, to
10 constitute a quorum for the transaction of busi-
11 ness.
