## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty-seven.

### AN ACT

To establish the Salaries of the District Attorney, the Assistant District Attorneys, and the Clerk of the District Attorney for the Suffolk District.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The salary of the district attorney  
2 for the Suffolk district shall be five thousand dol-  
3 lars a year; the salary of the first assistant dis-  
4 trict attorney for the Suffolk district shall be  
5 twenty-eight hundred dollars a year; the salary  
6 of the second assistant district attorney for the  
7 Suffolk district shall be twenty-five hundred dol-  
8 lars a year; the salary of the clerk of the district  
9 attorney for the Suffolk district shall be twelve  
10 hundred dollars a year: and at the same rates for  
11 any part of a year.

1    SECT. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsist-  
2 ent herewith are hereby repealed.

1    SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
