Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty-seven.

AN ACT

To amend an Act providing for the Appointment of Assistant Assessors of Taxes in the City of Worcester.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The mayor of the city of Worces-
2 ter shall annually,* in the month of April, appoint
3 one person in each ward of said city, who shall
4 be a resident therein, to be an assistant assessor,
5 and such other persons at large to be assistant
6 assessors as the city council from time to time
7 may by ordinance determine. Such assistant
8 assessors, on being confirmed by the board of
9 aldermen of said city, and having been sworn to
10 the faithful performance of their duties, shall be

11 qualified to perform all the duties of assistant
12 assessors. Any vacancy occurring in any such
13 offices, whether from death, resignation or other-
14 wise, shall be filled by appointment by the mayor
15 of some person who shall serve during the re-
16 mainder of such unexpired term.

1 SECT. 2. Section twenty-five of chapter one
2 hundred and ninety-nine of the acts of the year
3 eighteen hundred and sixty-six, and chapter
4 two hundred and thirty-six of the acts of the
5 year eighteen hundred and eighty-seven, and all
6 other acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this
7 act are hereby repealed.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage, but the persons elected assistant assess-
3 ors under existing laws shall continue in office
4 until the appointment and qualification of such
5 officers under this act.
