### RESOLVE

In favor of Oliver Avignon.

1 *Resolved*, That Oliver Avignon of Bolton, Connecticut,  
2 sole heir-at-law of Peter Avignon, late of Company I,  
3 Fifty-sixth Regiment, Massachusetts Volunteers, who  
4 died in Andersonville prison in the year eighteen hundred  
5 and sixty-four, is entitled to the sum of nine hundred  
6 and nineteen dollars and six cents, said sum being the  
7 amount of bounty received by the treasurer and receiver-  
8 general of said Peter Avignon on the twenty-fourth of  
9 March in the year eighteen hundred and sixty-four under  
10 the provisions of chapter sixty-two of the acts of the year  
11 eighteen hundred and sixty-two and chapter two hundred  
12 and fifty-four of the acts of the year eighteen hundred  
13 and sixty-three, and interest on the same to the twenty-  
14 fourth day of June current; and the said sum is hereby  
15 allowed to be paid to the said Oliver Avignon out of the  
16 Bounty Loan Sinking Fund, as provided for in chapter  
17 one hundred and twelve of the acts of the year eighteen  
18 hundred and eighty-two.
