AN ACT

Relative to the Staying or Superseding of Executions
by Writs of Review.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1 SECTION 1. Section thirty-nine of chapter one
2 hundred and eighty-seven of the Public Statutes, re-
3 lative to the staying or superseding of executions by
4 writs of review, is amended by inserting after the
5 word "entered" in the eleventh line thereof, the
6 following words: "The court or justice may also
7 order a stay or *supersedeas* without security when
8 the defendant has had no actual knowledge, before
9 judgment was entered, of the pendency of the
10 action against him."

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its pas-
2 sage.
