## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty-Four.

### RESOLVE

Granting an Allowance for the erection of Monuments on the Battlefield at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania.

*Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the treasury of the Commonwealth a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars each to the following named organizations, viz.: the first, second, seventh, ninth, tenth, eleventh, twelfth, thirteenth, fifteenth, sixteenth, eighteenth, nineteenth, twentieth, twenty-second, twenty-eighth, thirty-second, thirty-third and thirty-seventh regiments of infantry, first and second companies of Andrews Sharpshooters, first, third, fifth and ninth batteries of artillery, and the first regiment of cavalry, all Massachusetts Volunteers and engaged in the battle at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, for the purpose of erecting suitable monuments on the said battlefield, the said amount to be paid, upon the approval of the governor and council, to a duly authorized officer or committee of each association of the aforementioned organizations, if applied for within two years from the date of the passage of this resolve. The aggregate amount of payments under this resolve shall not exceed the sum of twelve thousand five hundred dollars.
