### AN ACT

To authorize a Floating Boat-house on Charles River  
in the City of Boston.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as  
follows:*

[ 1 SECTION 1. Permission is hereby given to  
2 George Faulkner of the city of Cambridge to lo-  
3 cate and maintain a floating boat-house on Charles  
4 River, in the city of Boston, near the Essex Street  
5 or Brookline Bridge, so called, outside the harbor  
6 line established by law, subject to the approval in  
7 writing of the board of harbor and land commis-  
8 sioners, as regards the mode of construction and  
9 location of said boat-house, the manner of anchor-  
10 ing or securing the same, and the term or terms  
11 of time for which the same may be maintained,  
12 and to all the provisions of chapter nineteen of

13 the Public Statutes applicable thereto; and sub-  
14 ject, also, to the consent of the mayor and alder-  
15 men of said city of Boston first obtained.

1    SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
