RESOLVE

In favor of the City of Boston.

Resolved, That a sum not exceeding fourteen thousand two hundred and seventy-six dollars and twenty-four cents be allowed and paid out of the treasury of the Commonwealth to the city of Boston for the payment of certain bills for support of state paupers at the Boston City Hospital, which have been audited and allowed by the board of health, lunacy and charity, and are now on file in the office of the state auditor, in sums as follows, to wit, viz. : —

The sum of sixty-five hundred and three dollars and fifty-six cents for a period dating from December twenty-two, eighteen hundred and eighty-two, to December thirty-one, eighteen hundred and eighty-three, and a further sum of seven thousand seven hundred and seventy-two dollars and sixty-eight cents for certain other bills incurred in like manner for the year ending December thirty-one, eighteen hundred and eighty-four.
